This Week in ELA:

We looked closely at letters Kk and Ww. Our "Carlos the Camera" alphabet card and "Winnie the Washer" alphabet card will help us remember these sounds. Letters K and C have the same alphabet card because they make the same sound. We focused on the sight words "look" and "with". We read and illustrated the poem *Up in the Arctic*. During writing workshop, we started our "How To" Writing Unit. In this unit, we will write steps to teach others how to do something like ride a bike, make a sandwich, and even SOAR in class. Ask your child what they are experts at, and think of the steps needed to complete this task.

This Week in Math:

We started adding! Daily, we look at math problems like: There were 2 red birds in my yard. 3 more red birds joined them. How many red birds are in my yard now? We learned how to draw a math picture, make a number bond, and write a number sentence.



This Week in Science:

We researched with Mrs. Peebles to learn about polar animals! We learned which animals live in the water, on land, and fly in the air. We also learned how blubber keeps animals warm and how animals camouflage themselves in the snow. Their dark hair falls out, exposing their white fur.
