This Week in FLA:

We looked closely at letters Pp and Dd. Our "Popping Popcorn" card and "Dancing Dinosaur" card will help us remember these sounds. We focused on the sight words "you" and "has". We read, acted out, and illustrated the poem Baa Baa Black Sheep. In independent reading, we learned that readers have super powers. One of our powers is called Pointer Power! We can point and read words (especially with our poems). During writing workshop, we talked about writing stories from our lives. If you can tell a story that happened to you, you can put it on paper. Talk with your child about ideas they could write about! We know we plan our story across the pages before we even pick up a pencil.

This Week in Math:

We practiced writing and counting numbers through 10. We counted objects in lots of different formations (rows, circular, scattered) and wrote the matching numerals. We know that two rows of five is one way to show the number ten.

This Week in Science:

We learned about pumpkins. We learned that pumpkins are harvested in fall. They grow on vines and come from seeds. We examined the various parts of a pumpkin such as the seeds, pulp, rind, and stem. We used our senses to explore both the exterior and interior of a pumpkin! We had FUN getting a little messy.
