This Week in ELA:

We focused on letters Pp and Tt, mastering their sounds, writing them, and sorting words that begin and end with these letters. We read, acted out, and illustrated Twinkle, Twinkle, Little Star. Our sight word this week was you, but we also reviewed has and had. During independent reading, we practiced pointing to and reading some words in the book. We looked for words from the title of our book on the pages! In writing workshop, we focused on our writing checklist. We want to keep our writing focused on one topic, make sure that we add lots of details to our illustrations, and write words that we can read. For example, in a story about baseball, a student may write: BSBL or even a simple sentence, "IPBSBL" (I play baseball). ©

This Week in Math:

We continued our counting practice in different configurations with numbers 6-10, utilizing our group of 5 as a "counting unit." We are learning to see a line of 5 dots and instantly recognize the quantity. This will help as we count higher numbers. We also talked a little bit about counting "one more than ____" but have more work to do with this next week!

This Week in Science:

We continued to study tree home animals. specifically learned about raccoons, owls, koala bears, and tree frogs. We know that these animals use trees for shelter and finding food.
