This Week in ELA:

We refocused our attention on letters Dd and Mm. We discussed how these letters sound, how to write them, and sorted words that begin and end with these letters. We read, acted out, and illustrated Jack and Jill. Our sight words this week were has and and. During independent reading, we continued reading storybooks. We focused on saying exact character words and connecting the story with words like then, next, and finally. In writing workshop, we are learning how to make our writing even better. We are continuing to stretch and write words that match our illustrations. We even used a checklist to help us. We want to make sure our books stick to 1 topic, that our pictures have details, and that we write words we can read back!

This Week in Math:

What an amazing week as mathematicians! We practiced forming numerals 7, 8, and 9! We also practiced counting objects in different configurations. One strategy we learned to ensure that we count correctly is to use a counting path. As we counted each counter, we drew a line to help us remember what we counted. Recounting helps, too!

This Week in Science:

We learned how trees are homes to many different animals. We took a nature walk and observed different animals or signs of animals (like nests) in the trees. We researched squirrels and birds, studying how they use trees for shelter and safety from predators. They also find their food therel
