This Week in ELA:

We focused on letters Nn and Bb, mastering their sounds, writing them, and sorting words that begin and/or end with these letters. We read, acted out, and illustrated Our Flag, a poem about one of our important U.S. symbols. Our sight words this week were in and on. During independent reading, we continued using our super powers. We learned how to use picture power. We check our pictures to help us read tricky words. We also used snap word power. We can read some words in a snap! We just have to study them closely, practice spelling them, and try writing them. In writing workshop, we continued our informational writing unit! We learned that to give good instructions, we need more than one word on the page! We also learned how important diagrams are in this type of writing. We label our pictures with specific words.

This Week in Math:

We continued our shape unit! We identified and described solid shapes. We studied cubes, spheres, cylinders, and cones. We also practiced positional words such as above, below, and beside.

This Week in Social Studies:

We learned about Veterans Day and some of the important symbols of our country. We can identify and describe the American flag, the bald eagle, and the Statue of Liberty. We know that our country celebrates having freedom. We can pick our clothes, eat food that we like, and do things that we like to do.
