This Week in ELA:

We focused on letter Ii. We learned that letter Ii is a vowel and that it makes a long sound and a short sound. We can recognize it, write it, and make both sounds. We read a short story called This Little Piggy and found letter Ii hiding in many words. Our sight words this week were it and is. During independent reading, we activated another super power- Sound Power. We learned how to look at the first letter of a word and fix our lips to make the sound. Combining this with picture power, we are figuring out some tough words! In writing workshop, we continued our informational writing unit! This week, we learned that sometimes authors put important words in **bold print** and also talk to their readers when they write how-to books. We practiced telling our readers, "Make sure you..." or "Next, you...". Mentor texts give us great ideas to use in our own writing!

This Week in Math:

We completed our shape unit, going to different shape math stations. We used geobaords, pattern blocks, solid shapes, and computer games to solidify our knowledge. We also learned a "shape train" game where we put shapes down that have at least one attribute in common with the previous shape (color, size, number of sides, etc.)

This Week in Social Studies:

This week, we started our Then and Now unit. We created a timeline showing how things have changed from long ago to now. We learned about communication, games, school, and transportation. While many things have changed over time, we know some things have stayed the same!
