This Week in ELA:

We focused on letters Cc and Ll, mastering their sounds, writing them, and sorting words that begin and/or end with these letters. We read, acted out, and illustrated Five Little Pumpkins. Our sight words this week were am and at. During independent reading, we continued using our super powers. We learned how to use sight words to check our reading. We asked, "Is our finger matching the word that we are saying?" If not, we needed to use "Reread Power" and try it again. We also practiced "Partner Power," helping each other grow as readers by working together. In writing workshop, we began our informational writing unit! We are learning how to plan and write "How To" books. These are books that give directions to readers. We thought of things we are good at and began trying to teach others!

This Week in Math:

We began our shape unit! This week we identified and described flat shapes such as triangles, hexagons, circles, and rectangles. We also learned that squares are a special kind of rectangle!

This Week in Science:

We studied pumpkins! We compared apples and pumpkins, discussing how they are different, and similar. We learned that some pumpkins are orange, white, red, green, or even blue. We were also able to examine the inside of a pumpkin-smelling and feeling the pulp/seeds.
