This Week in FLA:

We focused on letters Oo and Rr. Our "Bob the Fox" sound card and "Rosie the Robot" sound card will help us remember the sounds these letters make. We added on and him to the word wall. We read and illustrated Little Miss Muffet. In writing workshop, we focused on picture details this week. We talked about how to draw people in a more detailed way. We can even make people look like they are in motion! Drawing realistic pictures is an important step of the writing process.

This Week in Math:

We continued our conversation on measurement. We compared lengths of objects AND focused on heaviness and lightness of objects. Encourage your child to do some weight comparisons at home. Have him/her hold a toothbrush in one hand and a toothpaste tube in the other; a bath toy and a bar of soap: a stuffed animal and a book.

This Week in Social Studies:

We continued studying then and now, paying close attention to how space study has changed over time. People didn't always travel to space. We used to not have any technology to help us learn about it! Thanks to modern rocketry, satellites, space probes, and rovers, we can learn so much about outer space.
