This Week in ELA:

We focused on the sounds of long Ii and short Ii. We know rip is a short Ii word like "Pickles the Pig" but ripe is a long Ii word because the Ii "says its name" in the word. This week, we focused on hooking our reader with an introduction: "Have you ever made pancakes before? Let me teach you how!"
