This Week in ELA:

We learned about letter blends (sn, st, br, etc.) and digraphs (sh, ch, th). We see these a lot when reading and must get our mouth ready to say the letter sound(s). We encourage readers to look at the whole word, not just the beginning letters; sometimes words END with blends or digraphs (as in watch or fast)! We practiced writing, recognizing, and making the sounds/sign language for vowel Ee. We learned sight words boy and look. We found these words in leveled readers and in our nursery rhyme Little Boy Blue. We read, illustrated, and put motions to the poem as well.
