#### This Week in ELA:

We practiced recognizing, writing, and hearing the sound for Qq. We also reviewed vowel Ee, which is one of the trickier vowels. We read and illustrated a Qq poem about a conversation between a swan and a duck. Ask your child to recite it/act it out for you. During independent reading, we practiced story retell. We know that a strong retell means we name who was in the story, where the story happened, and what happened in the correct order. We also practiced the skill of making predictions. Our sight words this week were: but and were. Now is a great time to be reviewing our third quarter words: but were up all what look said that they boy out down. In writing workshop, we drafted our first persuasive speeches. We have more work to do in the coming weeks to prepare for our celebration!

#### This Week in Math:

We began breaking apart whole numbers 9 and 10. We found partners hiding within each number (for 9, we found 8 and 1, 7 and 2, etc.; for 10, we found 9 and 1. 8 and 2, 7 and 3, etc.). We wrote number bonds to match our problems.

#### This Week in Science:

We learned about different types of animal homes, specifically identifying burrows, dens, and pond habitats. We know that animals make their homes here to protect themselves and to find food. Some of the animals we learned about were meerkats, red foxes, spotted hyenas, and ducks.
