This Week in ELA:

We learned what an avid reader is! We found out that avid readers read a lot, find lots of places to read, keep a stack of books handy, and pay attention to what they are reading. We also practiced reacting to books. We know that books can make us laugh, cry, feel surprise, anger, or confusion. We practiced "dribbling," signing, and writing sight words here and are. In writing workshop, we jumped back into narrative writing, revisiting it from the beginning of the year. We have to think of something that happened to us and write about it using lots of detail. Our readers should know who it is about, where it is happening, and what is going on. We practice planning our stories on our fingers before we sketch and write them. We also want to make sure our illustrations help tell our story! We can't forget our details.

This Week in Math:

We began to study teen numbers. We decomposed our teen numbers as 10 ones and ____ ones. We practiced circling 10 and then writing how many are remaining. At home, practice writing teen numbers (making sure the one is always at the beginning). Discuss how it is 10 and some more ones.

This Week in Science:

We started our plant unit! We sorted nonliving and living objects and discussed what living things do and need to survive. We also learned what plants need to survive and thrive. We learned how they need water. sunlight, air, and a nutrient-rich soil. We also began learning about their parts-roots, stems, leaves, and flowers. Next week we will start planting. ©
