This Week in ELA:

In independent reading, we practiced using the connecting words, "AND THEN" to connect information from page to page. We also practiced saying, "I THINK" to "sprinkle" our own thinking onto the pages we read. In writing workshop, we learned about labeling our detailed illustrations. We use an imaginary rubber band to slowly stretch our words. We also learned to say, "I think I can" when something feels tricky. We practiced recognizing and writing letters Oo-Vv. Our shared reading focus was *Baa, Baa Black Sheep.* Our sight words this week were: **no** and **yes**.

This Week in Math:

Students practiced writing numerals 0-3. They also practiced counting a set of objects and writing the corresponding numeral as well as putting together simple number sentences (i.e. 3 = 2 + 1).

This Week in Science:

We learned about our five senses. We did some experiments to test our senses, such as guessing a particular sound or smell. One of our favorites was a taste test where we compared salty, sweet, and sour tastes! We ate pretzels, rice crispy treats, and sour patch kids.


