This Week in ELA:

We focused on letters Ii, Jj, Kk, Ll, Mm, Nn. We identified the letters, noticed the straight and curved lines that help form them, and talked a little bit about their sounds. We identified sight words a and the. We also read and acted out Jack and Jill. Poems help us build lots of different reading skills! During independent reading, we learned to read cover to cover and to connect our reading with the words "and then". Each page builds on what we have already seen or learned. We also launched writing workshop this week. We drew and wrote about things ranging from Pokémon to LOL Dolls!

This Week in Math:

We practiced sorting and grouping objects. We sorted by size, color, and shape. After sorting we counted how many objects were in each group. At home, practice sorting various objects such as coins, Legos, noodles. etc. After sorting, practice touch counting. Discuss which group has more or less.

This Week in Social Studies:

We talked about community leaders. We identified several community helpers such as police officers, firefighters, teachers, doctors, and electricians. We read books about police officers and learned that they have a badge and a radio. They keep us safe, make sure laws are followed, and help us if we need help.
