This Week in ELA:

We practiced recognizing, identifying sounds for, and writing letters Ii, Jj, Kk, Ll, Mm, and Nn! We read, acted out, and illustrated *Hey*, *Diddle Diddle*. Our sight words this week were can, me, and I. We continued building our stamina for buddy reading and independent reading. We practiced "see-saw" reading (reading back and forth with a buddy), learned how good readers read from cover to cover, and learned how good readers reread to learn new information. In writing workshop, we continued drawing pictures to tell a story. We discussed that when we think we are done, we really have just begun. Writers always look to see if they can add more to their words and pictures!

This Week in Math:

We continued to practice classifying and sorting. We learned the very last number we say is how many objects there are in all. We sorted objects by counting the total number of objects. We even began to "subitize" where we recognize the amount instantly by a quick glance.

This Week in Social Studies:

We continued to focus on what it means to be a good citizen. We discussed that good citizens are honest, responsible, and respectful.
