This week in reading, we recognized high frequency words when, then, and of. We also discussed the two different sounds that "oo" can make ("look" vs. "zoo"). We continued to practice identifying adjectives and know that they describe nouns. We read the poem *Animal Homes* and practiced vocabulary words "habitat" and "wetlands." In writing, we kicked off persuasive speeches. We solidified our knowledge of teen numbers through hands-on games, such as "Tic Tac Teen" or Teen Number Go Fish. When looking on two ten frames, we can "subitize," or quickly recognize, any number 11-20. We also have practiced forming number bonds with teen numbers. We know that all teen numbers have a group of ten and some number of extra ones.

This Week in Science/Social Studies:

This week in Social Studies we wrapped up our unit on African American History and moved into a study of Animal Habitats for our science focus.
