This Week in ELA:

This week in reading, we recognized high frequency words away, he, she, and this, and we discussed blends br, bl, st, and sp at the beginning of words. Additionally, we attended penguin research in the library and took notes about different kinds of penguins. In writing, we continued our persuasive writing by thinking about problems we have in our world. Our goal is to try and solve the problems by using our words, like The Lorax does in Dr. Seuss's book. We are writing signs, letters, songs, lists, books, etc. to try and make the world better!

This Week in Math:

In math, we continued to practice our addition facts in various ways. We used dominoes to add numbers, magnetic ten frames with counters, word problem BINGO, and computer games. We are all focusing on our fluency within five (and some within ten). This means when we see 2+3, we should quickly know the answer is 5 without drawing a picture. It takes practice, but we are catching on.

This Week in Science/Social Studies:

In science we researched penguins in the media center. We learned about where our penguins live, what their life cycle is like, what food they eat, and their physical characteristics.
