This week in reading, we practiced recognizing, writing, and hearing letters Ss, Tt, and Uu. We also read and illustrated the poem I'm a Little Pumpkin. We reviewed sight words to and my, and we continued practicing all of the words we learned this quarter. In writing, we continued writing a story across pages. We learned that our stories have a beginning, middle and end, just like the ones we read. We also discussed how important it is to use a storyteller voice instead of simple sentences like, "I can swim." We had another outstanding week of writing!

This Week in Math: We concluded our study of simple patterns and numbers 0-10 (not that we will ever entirely stop talking about those important numbers). While it may seem like "easy" content, the stronger grasp your child has on 0-10 number sense and fluency during the first quarter of kindergarten, the better off they will be as our content picks up. Starting next week, we are delving into 2-D and 3-D shapes!

This Week in Science:

This week we learned about pumpkins as part of our Fall unit of study. We learned about their life cycle and the many different things that pumpkins can be used for.
