This Week in ELA:

This week in reading, we practiced writing and recognizing jump and run. We read and illustrated Little Boy Blue and practiced finding *nouns* in our poem. We learned that a noun is a person, place, or thing. In writing workshop, we used a mentor text to teach us about good "How To" writing. We got ideas like making important words bold or giving our pictures labels and captions. We are also working on building our writing stamina and independence. We want to keep our pencil/crayon in our hand and write letters for the sounds we hear, even if there is no teacher to help us.

This Week in Math:

This week in math, we began distinguishing the difference between 2-D (flat) and 3-D (solid) shapes. We learned the names: cube, cylinder, sphere, and cone. Help your child identify these in your home.









This Week in Social Studies:

We have begun our "Then and Now" unit and are learning what life was like long ago. We know that clothes, transportation, and school looked very different. We will continue exploring this topic in the coming weeks investigating how things have changed over time. We are excited for our field trip to the Little Red Schoolhouse.
