This Week in ELA:

This week in reading, we practiced recognizing, writing, and hearing the difference between long and short Aa. Our nursery rhyme this week was Five Fat Turkeys. Ask your child to act it out and recite it for you! We went over sight words have and find. We also read many texts and engaged in research to discover how things have changed since long ago. In writing, we continued our informational writing unit! We talked about the importance of using a teaching voice and adding labels to our pieces (in addition to our sentences). We look forward to learning more about this style of writing in the coming weeks!

This Week in Math:

We explored our 2-D and 3-D shapes using geoboards, playdough, computer games, and shape riddle games. We have concluded our study of these shapes for now, but feel free to extend the conversation at home. See if your child can differentiate between both kinds of shapes- flat and solid. See if he/she can name and describe circles, squares, hexagons, rectangles, triangles, cubes, cylinders, cones, and spheres.

This Week in Science/Social Studies:

In social studies, we began our study of then and now. We researched this topic in the library with Mrs. Scullion and Mrs. Peebles. We also had visitors from the historic foundation come teach us about different games, clothes, and artifacts of the past. We are excited to continue this unit.
