#### This Week in ELA:

This week in reading, we added "this," "for," and "make" to the word wall. We also discussed long and short Ee. We read and acted out Children of the Rainbow, a poem about acceptance. Additionally, we talked about making predictions as we read our stories. We can use the pictures and any information we have already read to guess what may happen next. In writing workshop, we referenced our "heart maps" to write about problems that we care about solving. #### This Week in Math:

This Week in Science: We began some hands-on penguin murals, working with our group members to construct penguins in their habitat. Ask your child which penguin/habitat he/she is working on.
