#### This Week in ELA:

This week in reading, we went over sight words they, on, and off. Our vocabulary words were seedling and photosynthesis, as we embarked on our study of plants this week. In writing, we reflected and wrote about our experience in the garden. We also began our plant observation journals where we visit the garden and write about how our plant is changing. We did two observations this week. We are embarking on narrative writing once more beginning Monday, thinking of "small moment" stories from our lives.

#### This Week in Math:

We practiced fluency within the number ten using counting dots and our ladybug mats. We also practiced solving add to/change unknown problems, such as "There were three bunnies in the field.
