This week in reading, we practiced recognizing, writing, and hearing letters Ff and Gg. We also read and illustrated the poem *Humpty Dumpty*. We learned the new sight words go and like. We continued our independent reading block, emphasizing how good readers make predictions, thinking while they read about what will happen next. In writing workshop, we talked about how we never give up, even when we are drawing or writing something that seems difficult. We met the Little Engine That Could and learned to say, "I think I can," even when something is difficult to write.

This Week in Math:

This week in math, we continued to build number sense by orally counting and building our fluency within the number five. Our goal is to quickly recognize an arrangement of up to five dots in a line, an array, or scattered.
