This Week in ELA:

This week in reading, we practiced recognizing, writing, and hearing letters Kk and Ll. We also read and illustrated the poem *Hickory Dickory Dock.* We learned sight words *yes* and *no*, reviewing all of our previous words. We focused on identifying characters and setting in stories we read. In writing, we introduced a checklist for knowing when a piece is complete. We check for a picture that tells our story, details to make it better, words on the page, and we make sure we can read what we wrote. We had our first official "Author's Chair" time on Friday, with students sharing a story of their choice. The rest of our class will share on Monday. \odot

This Week in Math:

We continued solidifying our knowledge of numbers 0-10, sorting and counting objects, writing numbers to match quantities, and practiced creating patterns. We talked about the different ways to make patterns (AB, ABB, ABC, etc.) and explored math materials to create our own.
